Thanks to the generosity of the citizens of Fanwood and the borough council, we have taken delivery of a brand new ambulance, a state of the art, 2002 Road Rescue/Ford.



This rig has more room in the patient compartment, a smoother, quieter ride and streamlined controls and climate system. We maintain a special fund for our ambulances so we can always maintain and replace our single most important piece of equipment. It is diesel fueled for economy.

The familiar brown and tan body paint and gold leaf lettering were completed in September, and car 78 is now on the road.

As a 24/7 service, we need people to respond to calls at all hours of the day and night. There is no minimum weekly duty requirement, although members have to stay "active" over the course of a year by responding to calls, attending regular business meetings and participating in training drills.

All clothing (dress uniform, allweather jacket, etc.) is provided

for active members. Training to become an Emergency Medical Technician is free. Active



members become eligible for a pension if they remain with us for five years.
