CAPTAIN'S CORNER

Fellow residents - it is that time of the year, as holidays, family and the colder weather all approach. We all have to take care of each other during the colder months of the year.

Sometimes just sharing a friendly hello with an elderly neighbor or sharing a dinner to ensure they are doing well. "It takes a village" is the expression and our borough is no exception to this, with kindness and readiness everywhere you look. All you have to do is ask, and help will be on the way before you know it. Post it on social media, message friends, or call for help by phone. Don't wait until it is too late or you really need the help. We have endured a lot in the past years from a pandemic to a tough economic market, and interesting times continue with costs increasing. There is no reason to feel you are alone dealing with these issues and help is there if you need it.

In preparation for and during the winter storms, clear ice, snow, leaves, and other debris from driveways, downspouts and doorways. Ensure you have prescriptions refilled, easy access to flashlights and water, and charge up your mobile phones and other devices. Check in with neighbors before, during and after storms to make sure they are ok. Have your heating system serviced and filter cleaned or replaced to ensure the best performance. Colder weather means more time indoors, so ensure your fire and carbon monoxide detectors are working properly and have batteries. Stock up on necessities in advance, and don't wait right before storms as supplies dwindle fast. During the colder seasons we see more falls, injuries and calls for help at home.

Tips and Tricks for the colder seasons:

- Be sure to bundle up in layers as the winter temperatures set in
- Cover your head as the majority of body heat is lost from this location so use hats, scarves and whatever you like to feel warmer
- Fingers and toes need more care as they get cold first (I love my wool socks)
- Minimize alcohol intake and be active as much as possible
- Find that favorite book of the season and read it while watching the snow fall or frost form
- Close doors and seal gaps where air seeps into your house
- Keep an up-to-date list of medicines and medical conditions

Other novel suggestions:

- Use a pair of socks to keep car wiper blades free of ice
- · Sanitizer is a natural de-icer for frozen door locks
- Ceiling fans can be used in the winter rotating clockwise to disperse heat in a room

Protect yourself and your health by forming good sleep habits, eating a balanced diet, drinking lots of fluids and taking medication appropriately. Make incremental changes - instead of that big festive meal for Thanksgiving or Christmas, try smaller meals spread out. Little changes can make a big difference in all of our lives. If you feel ill, reach out to your healthcare provider and treat it aggressively. You know your body and when things are not right, you know it so listen to your inner voice. Vaccinations and preventative care are important but are not perfect. In the event you need immediate medical help, pick up the phone and dial or text 911. Make sure you tell the emergency dispatcher your name, address, what is wrong, when did this start and any pertinent medicines or medical history. This is where that up-todate list of medicines, insurance information, medical conditions and providers will come in handy. Don't hang up the phone until the dispatcher tells you to and as help arrives, you will be on your way to assistance. We are here for your emergency needs.


